Work in Schools to Combat Youth Violence, Knife Crime and Support to Stay Safe



During September and October, the GM2LF Big Local Partnership worked with Loudmouth Education & Training to deliver their theatre in education programmes on safeguarding to nearly 300 children in the three schools across the area, Grace Mary, St James and Oakham Primary School.

Loudmouth ran two programmes:

- Helping Hands on staying safe, including work around grooming, domestic abuse and the NSPCC PANTS rule.
- Youth Violence Assemblies on Knife Crime

The team at Loudmouth delivered the sessions by using drama and discussions as a safe and engaging way to support children in learning about safe contact with others and explore youth violence with a particular focus on knife crime and county lines. The aim is to raise awareness, support and safeguard children from an early age.
